The following activities outline the progress of the Jefferson County Alliance and its members from 2008-2009 towards organizational development, collaboration, and advocacy.

ORGANIZATIONAL DEVELOPMENT:

- Developed the organizations strategic plan for 2008-2009
- Improved the method for fulfilling the strategic plan goals by having subcommittees form and meet monthly to work on each area of focus: Marketing, Planning and

- Collaboration, Prevention, prior to the regular Alliance meetings.
- Developed a website, logo, and letterhead.
- Continued development, updating, and use of a "Resource Guide" to effectively inform community of available resources.
- Conducted a Stakeholders Survey to focus on priorities.
- Continued work to locate resource funding to be of assistance to service providers addressing issues of poverty, social, and medical services.

COLLABORATION

- Continued to offer "Assistance grants" to Alliance member organizations that help support the purpose of the Alliance.
- Continued support and oversight of the "Family Centered Systems of Care" Flexible Funds grant money that assist and benefit families in Jefferson County, which have Severely Emotionally Disturbed children.
- Support and pursuit of the St Francis Health Center Grant, which was used to develop the Lakeside Village Initiative. This initiative offers free monthly health clinics to help county residents who are uninsured or under insured to gain access to health care.

 Preventative primary healthcare and mental health screenings are also available. The clinics are staffed by medical

- personnel from the McLouth Medical Clinic, the Jefferson Health Department, and The Guidance Center for mental Health services. Social Service organizations are also present to highlight organizations and resources.
- Support and pursuit of the Healthy Kids/Healthy Communities Grant that addresses childhood obesity in rural areas. The Alliance took the lead on the grant and partnered with 5 other counties in Northeast Kansas region. The Regional Prevention Center served as the administrative agency.
- Quality of Life Survey results placed on Alliance newly developed website to inform residents of needs in Jefferson County.
- The Alliance members met and noted positive forces in social/medical service realms of the county.

COLLABORATION

- Stakeholders survey and responses to determine continued priorities.
- Planning and Collaboration Committee working to increase awareness of resources and availability to county residents, by updating resource guide and find means of dissemination/availability through bound copies and CD's.
- Prevention Committee working to provide insight and effects of poverty to understand effective ways to address social concerns through Poverty Simulation and Ruby Paine training.
- Marketing Committee working to continue development of newly created website and growth of this media to reach a greater population. Focus on volunteer recognition in

the community through 'The Spirit of Humanitarianism Award" and awards ceremony.

ADVOCACY

- Working to provide training on the issues of poverty, to better understand and be able to address the needs of our community, in these areas.
- Supported the collaborative effort of area social agencies and providers, to establish the "Lakeside Village Initiative", which helps the uninsured and underinsured gain access to healthcare.
- ➤ Continued the 9th year of support for the oversight of the FCSC Flexible Funds money, which provides funds for those families in the community, who have severely, emotionally disturbed children, and need assistance with housing, utilities, and other daily living essentials, but do not have the community resources to address these needs.
- Supported efforts and collaboration with other health depts. and Regional Prevention Center, to target policy changes through "Healthy Kids/Health Communities" grant for helping reduce obesity.

- Provided support to The Jefferson County Sheriff's Dept. in their presentation "Drug Endangered Children", which provides education and the goal of future legislative action, to reduce the negative effects of dangerous drugs and their manufacturing on children. Further advocated to help Deputy Debbie Seifert expand and present to another community council/social agencies in Leavenworth.
- Provided a venue for policy discussion, shaping, and influence.
